Working closely with the School Events Officer the post holder will help design and deliver an annual calendar of school festivals, competitions and events.

A good working knowledge and understanding of PE, school sport and physical activity and what constitutes high quality provision is essential for this role. The successful candidate will support schools to develop more active lunchtimes and develop and promote ideas for schools to provide daily physical activity for children.
