How did this fit in with your personal life?

It was a case of managing my time well. I didn't feel it was too intrusive and it wasn't incredibly time consuming. It was actually quite an enjoyable experience!

What has surprised you the most about doing the new standard qualification?

The introduction of the exams at the end of the qualification, I had discussed with colleagues who had done the Framework NVQ where they had completed paperbased modules, so once they had finished the last module, that was their completion.

And how do you feel about going through the final exam and professional discussion?

At first it was slightly daunting but I believe due to the training of the standard I will feel much more prepared than what the framework would have provided.
