## Welcome to Osmaston Park



Osmaston Park was formally farmland owned by the Wilmot family of Osmaston. The family owned Osmaston Hall which was originally located on nearby Ascot Drive. The present-day park is a remnant of the rural landscape which once dominated this area. The park was gifted to the people of Derby, at the time Rolls-Royce came to Derby in 1907. Many adventures have been had by children and families of all generations in the three distinct woodland areas, Ash Wood, Oak Wood and across the road at the rear of Moorways Sports Village, Elm Wood. The park still brings joy to so many, including a BMX track attracting locals and enthusiasts alike.





### Routes






Routes are generally on hard surfaces, but some may be on gravel/bark surface. There are some woodland paths which may become muddy at times, and you may need to consider the weather conditions when choosing your route. Some surfaces may include tree roots, and all routes may have overhanging branches. Routes are directed throughout by corresponding coloured discs. Follow the symbols below so you know what to expect on each route.
